### 2017-2018 LEGISLATOR VOTES

Legislative leadership is more than just taking votes, that is why we're including these votes reflecting positions on faith, family and religious freedom. Votes reflect bills that sitting legislators supported (or opposed) that move our state in the wrong direction.

**SB 501 CD1 THE BULLY BILL:** Requires all limited service pregnancy centers to disclose the availability of and enrollment information for reproductive health services. Defines limited service pregnancy center. Establishes privacy and disclosure requirements for individual records and information. Authorizes civil penalties and civil actions for enforcement and remedy. The bill passed both the House and Senate on 05/02/2017. It was signed into law by Governor Ige on 07/11/17 as Act 200 (Gov. Msg. No. 1314). **HFA SUPPORTED A NO VOTE.**

**SB 270 CD1 THERAPY BAN BILL:** Prohibits specific state-licensed persons who are licensed to provide professional counseling from engaging in, attempting to engage in, or advertising sexual orientation change efforts on minors. Establishes the sexual orientation counseling task force to address the concerns of minors seeking counseling on sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expressions, and related behaviors. The bill passed both the House and Senate on 05/01/18. It was signed into law by Governor Ige on 05/25/18 as Act 013 (Gov. Msg. No. 1113). **HFA SUPPORTED A NO VOTE.**

**HB2739 HD1 ASSISTED SUICIDE:** Establishes a regulated process under which an adult resident of the State with a medically confirmed terminal disease and less than six months to live may choose to obtain a prescription for medication to end the patient's life. Imposes criminal sanctions for tampering with a patient's request for a prescription or coercing a patient to request a prescription. The bill passed both the House (03/23/18) and Senate (03/29/18). It was signed into law on 04/05/18 as Act 002 (Gov. Msg. No. 1102). **HFA SUPPORTED A NO VOTE.**
